

Unique Glass Colors Faux Reactive Glass Technique

NT Colors and Crystal Ice ACCENTS

I am creating a background for a snowflake piece and thought I would share the process as it came out looking sooooooool! And it is sooooooool easy! You will need 1956 Dark Blue, 1994 Baby Blue and 1959 Teal Blue (or any color combination you wish!) and 703 Crystal Ice ACCENTS (or any of our other ACCENTS colors and a piece of clear glass.

Now for the really hard part. Using the colors in their powder form— randomly sift Dark Blue , then Teal Blue then Baby Blue over the glass. I did not want opaque coverage so worked over a light box so I could see my coverage. Using the wrong end of my paintbrush I dropped Crystal Ice onto the surface. Mix the Crystal Ice very well so all the nice sparkly particles are distributed evenly. That's it!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

I used float glass and fired to 1450 as I just wanted to set all my color before adding my top layer of glass. It is so fun when you get these cool reactions when you weren't even trying!!!!!!!!!!!!!! Here are some reference photos showing the finished look. Have fun with your own "reactions!"
